Andrew Napier came from Jerviston Square Village, Lanarkshire, Scotland in 1868 to Pennsylvania (USA). He did coal mining in Tioga County, PA, by 1870. He ended up in Moline, IL, and married Mariah Jane Green from Carbon Cliff, IL. They married and moved to Colchester, IL. Mariah's parents were William Green and Jane Cooper, originally from Wolverhampton, England.

They moved to Mystic, IA and raised a family, all boys. One set of twins died very young. After retirement Andrew moved to Topeka, KS and then to Stanberry, MO to live with oldest son, Alexander (my grandfather) sometime in 1930s. They both died in 1935/6.

Alexander Napier married Mary Margaret (Root) from Bement, IL. They raised three

boys in Stanberry. They lost twin boys, Ray and Roy, in 1927. Harry Eugene eldest, Bobbie Alexander (my father) and Max Andrew.

Bobbie came to Minnesota after WWII, after his father died, to go fishing with his two uncles William, Harold, and cousins.

William and Helen (Geisler) Napier were good friends of my mother's father, Carl Pence and Adeline (Petit). The family went on a picnic and my dad told his cousin Gene (Eugene) that when he spotted my mother, Dorothy, sitting next to Gene's wife, Helen, that she's the girl

he was going to marry. Gene told him no way!! Well way - they were married a year later, May 1949. My father never left Minnesota. They lived in St. Paul, MN. They had nine children: Margaret Mary (me), Gregory John, Judith Francis, Sandra Joan, Bruce Robert, Stephan Paul, David Joseph, Sharon Elizabeth and Janet Louise. Dad died in August 1975.
